PARTICIPATION COSTS (USD)

\$3,600 Early Bird Rate \$4,000 program fee includes:

- All in-person and online workshops, site visits, and guest speakers in Hong Kong and San Francisco
- Costs also included for the 7-day Educator Exchange in San Francisco:

Through a series of social innovation and education training sessions offered in HK and a week-long Educator Exchange hosted by VIA in Silicon Valley, participants will build connections across cultures and explore their own potential as educators, entrepreneurs, and social impact leaders.
